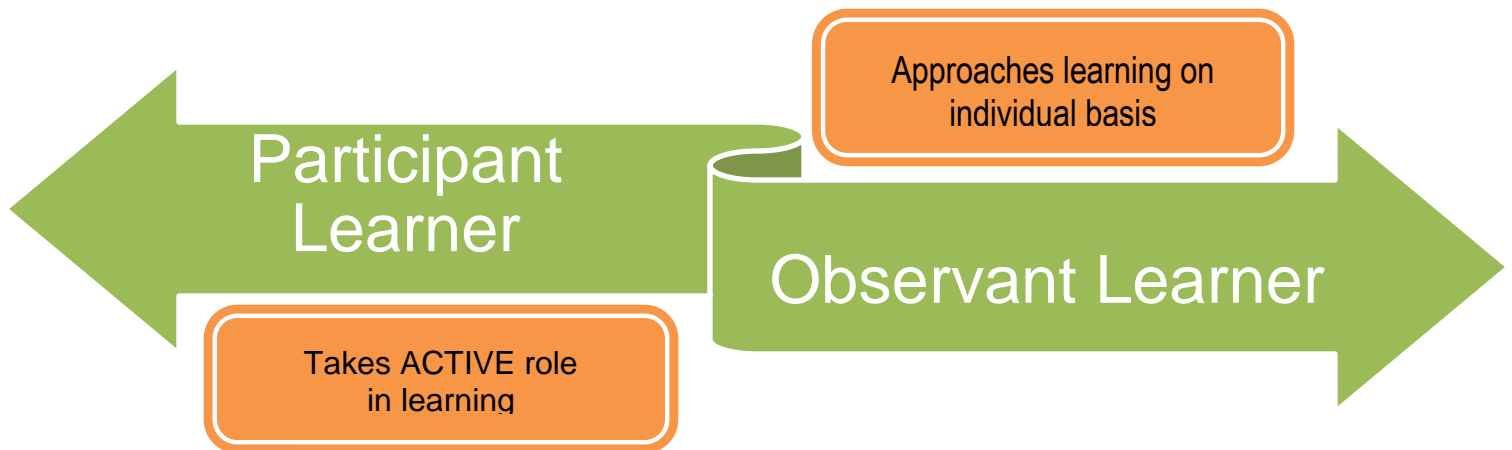


What's YOUR Learning Style?
